Kenyon's Results from the 2019 HEDS Sexual Assault Campus Climate Survey

The HEDS Sexual Assault Campus Climate Survey was deployed to all Kenyon students from January 23 to February 20, 2019. Of the 1,827 students invited to participate, 435 students completed the survey for a 24% response rate, down from a 31% response rate in 2017. Though the survey was completed by more than twice as many students who identified as women than men (66% women, 30% men, 4% non-binary) each cohort was well represented in the responses (First-years = 28%, Sophomores = 24%, Juniors = 22%, Seniors = 21%).

The results of the HEDS Sexual Assault Campus Climate survey pose a challenge in that they are more personal than the results of almost all other Kenyon surveys. Our goal in this reporting is to balance transparency and privacy so that data can inform policy and education while carefully protecting individual respondents. Due to the extremely sensitive nature of this survey, data needed to meet the following criteria in order to be published:

- 1. Representative of 6 or more students. Some cases required combining categories to meet the minimum while other cases did not allow for reporting at all. If no students fell into a category, zeros are reported. Data that did not meet the 6 student threshold is indicated with a double dash (--).
- 2. Indicative of overall trends on campus rather than specific characteristics of an assault.
- 3. Not biasing or limiting the overall context of the data by privileging one narrative over another (e.g. the experiences of women over men).
